

Emergency Contraception: Know the Facts!

- **MYTH:** Emergency contraception (EC) is an abortifacient and will end a pregnancy.
 - FACT: EC is contraception that prevents pregnancy after sex. It will not harm or end an existing pregnancy.
- **MYTH:** Plan B One-Step® is the only type of EC currently available.
 - **FACT:** There are three types of EC currently approved for use:
 - 1. Plan B One-Step®, a single pill made of the hormone levonorgestrel, is available over-the-counter without a prescription. There are also numerous generic versions of Plan B One-Step® that should be stocked right next to the Plan B One-Step®.
 - 2. ella®, a single pill made of ulipristal acetate, is available by prescription only.
 - 3. ParaGard®, a copper intrauterine device (IUD) that does not contain hormones and is the most effective form of EC, is inserted by a health
- **MYTH:** You must go to the pharmacy counter and show identification to purchase levonorgestrel-based EC pills.
 - ▼FACT: Plan B One-Step® and its generics are approved for over-the-counter sale and are available on the shelves at most retail stores, as well as health clinics and many campus health centers.
- **MYTH:** You have to be an adult woman to purchase EC pills.
 - FACT: Plan B One-Step® and its generics are approved for sale to all people regardless of age or gender. No ID check required.
